The camp site is run by the Christchurch District Scout Council as a camping and training centre.

FACILITIES.

Special 60' x 20' Cabin for emergency use, First Aid room, Mains Water, Wash Basins, Flush Toilets, Provador with souvenirs sweets and limited groceries.

Open Air Chapel in quiet corner of the site. Camp Fire circle seating 400.

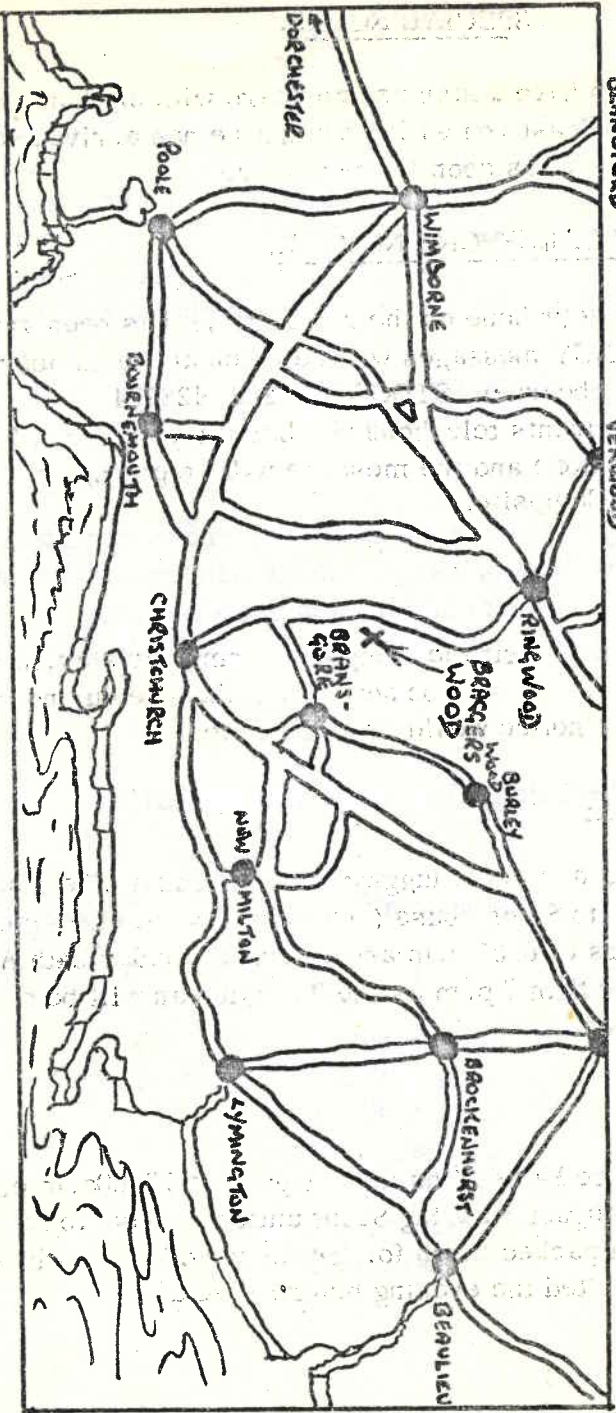

MAP OF AREA AND DIRECTIONS

Eastest approach is by Picker Post on A31. Map ref: 192/062 OS map 195. South to Burley.
 Turn right in centre of village towards Bransgore. After about 2 miles turn right at cross-roads. Follow road down hill for about one mile and the site will be found on the right hand side.



SPECIAL NOTES.

Poole Harbour. A ferry trip across the bay to the island, the site of Lord Baden Powell's very first scout camp, now a bird sanctuary. On the other side of the island, beautiful sandy beaches for swimming.

H. M. S. VICTORY

Portsmouth - Nelson flagship. Conducted tours by Navel Cadets. Museums with plenty of interest to all.

PONY TREKING

A tour through the New Forest on horse back.

BADGER AND DEER WATCHING

By arrangement with a New Forest warden, a night visit to see Badgers and herds of Deer in their natural surroundings.

TUCKTONIA

Britain in miniature. See Britains most famous buildings in miniature with a working airport and harbour.

CAMP FIRE SINGSONG

Typical scout singsong with the whole campsite. Camp fire has seating for 400.

FOOTBALL MATCH

Against a local scout troop.

POOLE HARBOUR AND POTTERY

Fishing harbour and a visit to the famous Poole Pottery factory.

PIONEERING

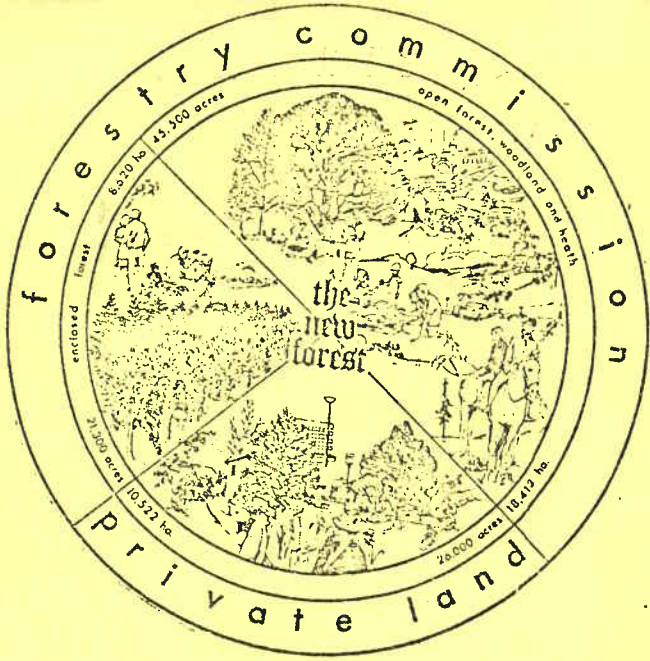
Various projects using the camp pioneering equipment.
